Launch of Québec City's social Economy Hub

Québec City, February 21, 2018 - The Maison de la Coopération - a group of 10 organizations dedicated to accompanying social enterprises, cooperatives and not-for-profits - wishes to formalize its service continuum and demonstrate its role as **Québec City's Social Economy Hub**.

The goal of the continuum is to offer a wide range of services to social economy stakeholders in the Quebec and Chaudière-Appalaches regions and to respond to all their needs: support with startup, financing, coaching in communication, marketing, information technology, support in organizational development, accounting, human resources, legal services, training, facilitation and engagement, room and office rental, and much more.

Between 4 pm and 6 pm, there will be a tour to meet each of the members and discover how they can support community projects.

Ms. Dianne Maltais, representative from the Caisse d'économie solidaire Desjardins, the primary financial institution specialized in social economy, will be the event spokesperson. Ms. Dominique Anglade, Quebec's Minister of Economy, Science and Innovation, will be represented by Mr. André Drolet, Member for Jean-Lesage. Mr. Régis Labeaume, Mayor of Quebec City, will also be present.

The Maison de la coopération members and close collaborators include CDEC de Québec, CEDEC, Communagir, Conseil des métiers d'art du Québec, Consortium de ressources et d'expertises cooperatives, Fonds d'emprunt Québec, Groupe Conseils DDE, Pôle des entreprises d'économie sociale de la région de la Capitale-Nationale, Sine Qua Non, regroupement d'avocats, and Solidarité Sud. Social enterprise carries out economic activity for social outcomes, which means that it sells or exchanges goods and services not to make a profit, but to respond to the needs of its members or host community. According to Chantier de l'économie sociale, across Quebec this sector represents more than 7,000 organizations, 200,000 jobs and \$40 billion in revenue generated, which is more than the construction, aerospace and mining sectors combined.
